Remembrance Day 2019

Remembrance Day 2019 ceremonies were well attended by approximately 50 participants. It was gratifying to see so many residents taking the time to remember the sacrifices made for us. Our ceremony is unique in that we honour each person named on the Head, Clara and Maria Veterans Memorial.

The Veterans Memorial has come to be an important landmark in our community because of one veteran's dream to honour those who served their country. I quote from the pamphlet that was distributed the day of the official opening of the monument.

"In 2005, The Year of the Veteran in Canada, Mr. J. Ernie Boudreau returned to Europe 61 years after his initial landing during WWII. As a Canadian Veteran, he was touched by the war memorials throughout Europe and the honour that they bestowed onto Veterans, even half a century after the war. When he returned to Canada, Ernie put into motion a project that would bestow the same honour onto his comrades from Head, Clara and Maria and enable you, their families, friends, and future generations of Canadians to remember them. The memorial before you is the result of that vision as well as the caring effort of many members of our community.

Although the United Townships of Head, Clara and Maria is a small municipality of approximately 225 residents, 179 of our citizens have served in the military between 1914 and 2005, the Year of the Veteran. Their sacrifices and achievements helped to build both the country and the communities in which we live today, and we are extremely proud of their contributions and their courage. We were fortunate that of 179 Veterans, only ten did not return home. Those ten are especially remembered here."

Each name is read and remembered, those who returned and those who died in service. With this memorial, the memory of our Township's residents who served and made the ultimate sacrifice will never fade. If you are a veteran who has come to reside in Head, Clara and Maria since the Veteran's Memorial project was completed and would like to be recognized on Remembrance Day please let me know.

I would like to thank the volunteers who assisted at our service: Former Mayor Jim Gibson; the Ernie Boudreau family — David Balla-Boudreau, Cathy Sutherland, Heather Sutherland; Councillors Fran Kelly-Chamberlain, Ernie Villeneuve, Chris Dowser, Brent Allen; Staff member Stephany Rauche and residents Marlene Gibson, Andy Boisonneault.



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Only occurrences that do not involve an injury, a suspect or evidence are applicable.

If required, an officer will contact you in 72 hours.

All information submitted through Online Reporting is confidential.

Every report will be carefully reviewed by an officer for accuracy, completeness and any other information relevant to the occurrence.

An automatic report number will be provided once an online report is completed.

The municipal office will be closed December 24th at noon and will reopen January 6th at 8:30 am.

A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FIRE MARSHALL AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT





- Flashlight and batteries
- ☐ Radio and batteries or crank radio
- ☐ Spare batteries (for radio or flashlight)
- ☐ First-aid Kit
- □ Candles and matches/lighter
- Extra car keys and cash
- ☐ Important papers (identification)
- ☐ Food and bottled water
- Clothing and footwear
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- ☐ Toilet paper and other personal items
- ☐ Medication
- ☐ Backpack/duffel bag (to hold all of the emergency survival kit items)
- ☐ Whistle (to attract attention, if needed)
- Playing cards

*Three-day supply per person

Your emergency survival kit should have everything you and your family would need to be safe and take care of yourselves for at least three days immediately following an emergency.

Tips:

- Pack the contents of your kit in an easy-to-carry bag(s) or a case on wheels.
- Store your kit in a place that is easy to reach, and ensure that everyone in your family knows where it is.
- Your water supply is meant to cover what you would drink as well as what you might need for food preparation, hygiene and dishwashing.
- Check and refresh your kit twice a year—when the clocks shift to/from daylight savings time is a good time. Check all expiry dates and replace food and water with a fresh supply. Check batteries and replace as needed.
- Keep your cell phone or mobile device fully charged.
