

That was made from approximately 36 wine bags, 791 pounds of aluminum copper and brass, 5,341 large liquor bottles, 340 small liquor bottles, 8630 beer bottles, 66,642 beer cans and 52,133 pop cans (1409) pounds.

What made this so successful? **People spreading the word was # 1**. Being present at the disposal sites to meet people and explain what we were doing and collect their donations was vital. Not only did we meet many people, we raised awareness of the library. Most times, I drove home with a van packed to the roof. In addition, Jim had to come often to take items in his truck.

Pine Valley, Morning Mist Resort donated their saved up recycling and Antler's Kingfisher Lodge donated their saved returnable liquor and beer bottles. As well, Pine Valley, Morning Mist gave us access to their recycling throughout the summer.

Thanks to the many people who also came forward to help sort items, and regularly took items to be cashed in at the Beer Store. That was a tremendous help!. Many times we arrived home to find that people had delivered their returnables to the "sorting shelter"

At the same time, other fund raising efforts were taking place: Betty Condie was selling her tomato plants and flowers and later her fruit jellies and collecting Valu-Mart receipts. Mel Theil was selling secondhand books and DVDs from her camp site. The library also received several monetary donations from people in and outside the community.

We would be remiss if we did not extend a special thank you to my husband Jim, without whose support, this would not have been possible. He was there – every step of the way!
